2024 is just a preview of the exciting journey ahead!



Our 2024 Grants

Best Chance Program

Grant Amount \$150,000

- 2024 marked the launch of the Best Chance Program which was a resounding success.
- The program sponsors monthly, no-cost vaccine clinics for dogs and cats across Seattle and is administered by the Seattle Animal Shelter staff and volunteers. There were also 474 surgeries scheduled in 2024.
- **Urgent Need**: The community lines up as early as 8am for clinics that open at 10 am a testament to the urgent need. Beyond vaccines, the clinics provide a free veterinary check-up, flea treatment and deworming, microchipping, pet licensing and free pet supplies.
- **Inclusivity**: Flyers translated into multiple languages are available, outreach focuses on underserved populations and building lasting trust in communities.

2024 Best Chance Program Highlights



Animals assisted: 1,533



Families served: 941



Supplies distributed (food, leashes, collars, etc): 17,085



Vaccines administered: Dogs (2,460); Cats (728)

Existing Programs

Grant Amount \$75,000

The Existing Programs grant supports SAS in four major areas:

- Financial support for owned pets
- Care for animals currently in the shelter
- Community outreach and engagements
- Staff and volunteer training

Owned animal assistance is one-way donations are turned into community action and support. The goal is to help people keep their pets by assisting with supplies and financial support to cover items like vet care and behavior support.

From waived adoption fees to avoid long stays, to licensing fee support that helps owners reclaim lost pets - these funds turn compassion into action.

In 2024, our support helped power community food banks, which represented 47 different ZIP codes across the region and served:



Foster Care Program

Grant Amount \$125,000

This grant funds a full-time Foster Coordinator and consulting support vital to managing the Seattle Animal Shelter's foster program. The coordinator works closely with the veterinary and animal care teams to identify which animals would most benefit from a foster home - especially those struggling in the shelter environment.

SAS has hundreds of potential foster parents, and the coordinator identifies which pups most need a break and highlights them in a regular email update to fosters. These foster volunteers are literally life savers, and the entire process is made possible by the Foster Care Program.

Behavior Program

Grant Amount \$50,000

Although the dedicated Behaviorist role was vacant for much of 2024, the Seattle Animal Shelter continued to meet critical behavior needs by reallocating funds to staff and contractors who stepped in to provide support.

Behavior services were provided for:

155 cats

otlight: Dash

Surrendered in August 2024 due to escalating behavioral challenges, Dash had bitten multiple people and was in crisis. Through structured training with SAS staff, access to agility equipment, and consistent behavioral support, he made tremendous progress. By October, Dash was adopted into a new home a powerful reminder of the potential in every animal when given the right support.
